Objectives

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course was designed for physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, and pharmacists.

STATEMENT OF NEED

According to the American Pain Foundation, more than 76.5 million Americans are affected by pain. This number is larger than the number of people affected by diabetes, heart disease and cancer combined. Several provisions from the National Pain Care Policy Act of 2009 were included in the Health Care Reform Bill of 2010 because pain is recognized as area where the quality of care should be improved.

GOAL

The goal of this program is to improve your skills in assessing and treating pain in the adult.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES

1. Describe the opioid prescribing guidelines applicable to your primary care office setting.
2. Define opioid compliance monitoring strategies for your ambulatory patients.
3. Explain some of the functional consequences of long term pharmacologic treatments of pain.
4. Define the known pain models and pain generators and their relevance to the care of your patients.
5. Compare analgesic management options for acute and subacute pain.
6. Review analgesic management of persistent pain including the 4 classes of medication used in the treatment of pain.
7. Discuss how preoperative treatment with commonly prescribed opioids - as well as buprenorphine and methadone - influence post operative analgesic management.
8. Discuss the use of opioids in the emergency room setting.
9. Discuss treatment options and potential barriers to optimal treatment of 4 types of high risk pain patients.
10. Discuss coordination of patients in 4 high risk categories.
11. Explain current federal and state guidelines related to analgesic management with controlled substances.
12. Discuss barriers to effective pain management for your patients and what you can do to address these.
