Objectives

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program was designed for physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, physician assistants and others.

STATEMENT OF NEED

Western Massachusetts has the second highest rate of HIV in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Practitioners continue to see large numbers of new patients with HIV/AIDS. In western Massachusetts, mental health and substance abuse are frequent comorbidities which impact the ability to treat patients with HIV. In addition, viral hepatitis coinfection significantly impacts the health of up to half of HIV-infected patients. It is important for clinicians caring for patients with HIV/AIDS to keep abreast of new development and current issues in a rapidly changing field. This course is designed to help attendees to provide optimal care to patients with HIV/AIDS and related complications.

GOAL

The goal of this program is to provide health care providers with a state-of-the art update on the diagnosis and management of the patient infected with HIV.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES

1. Identify how mental health issues affect patients with HIV.
2. Determine when and how to use mental health experts for HIV infected patients.
3. Identify important recent HIV clinical studies which may impact management of HIV.

6. Determine the appropriate workup and management of liver disease in HIV patients.
