Objectives

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for psychiatrists and primary care physicians, psychologists, clinical social workers, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, substance abuse counselors, and clergy.

STATEMENT OF NEED

Almost 20% of people in the U.S. population have a substance use disorder at some point in their lives, yet one-half or more of the cases of current substance use disorders go undetected by medical providers. Untreated addiction is more expensive than 3 of the nation's top 10 killers: 6 times more expensive than America's number one killer: heart disease (\$133.2 billion/year), 6 times more than diabetes (\$130 billion/year), 4 times more than cancer (\$96.1 billion/year). There is evolving knowledge regarding the causes and best practices for treating addiction. This program will provide you with an update on addiction and co-morbid issues that often present as problematic for the healthcare professional.

GOAL

This program is designed to enhance your knowledge and skills in order to meet the complex needs of addicted individuals.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES

By participating in this program you should be able to:

- Discuss the latest research on the physiological basis of addiction.
- Explain why some chemicals are addicting and others are not.
- Describe the neurophysiology of drug seeking behavior.
- Discuss the impact of at least 5 addicting chemicals on consciousness, behavior and physiology.
- Describe effective medical and behavioral interventions for at least 4 addictive chemicals.
- Develop practical strategies to effectively assess and manage the patient who presents with pain and addiction issues.
- Describe a integrated care model for opiate replacement treatment and pain management.
- Explain the components of a coordinated system of care involving primary care clinicians, behavioral health providers, and pain management specialists.
- Explain the relationship between violence/abuse and substance abuse.
- Discuss the impact of trauma on men and women in the process of addiction and recovery.
- Discuss strategies for trauma informed substance abuse treatment, including a trauma informed assessment and screening.
