(ACLS) Advanced Cardiac Life Support
Basic Life Support (BLS) is a prerequisite. This two-day course is designed to give physicians, dentists, nurses, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, emergency medical personnel and others the knowledge and skills to evaluate and manage an adult who experiences a sudden cardiopulmonary arrest. The ACLS course uses case based teaching. The cases cover respiratory emergencies, 4 types of cardiac arrest: (simple VF, VT, PEA and asystole), and 5 types of pre-arrest emergencies (bradycardia, stable tachycardia, unstable tachycardia, acute coronary syndromes and acute stroke)

(ATLS) Advanced Trauma Life Support
This two-day course is designed to provide physicians with a minimum standard of care for the trauma victim. The ATLS course emphasizes the first hour of initial assessment and primary management of the trauma patient starting at the time of injury and continuing through initial assessment, lifesaving intervention, re-evaluation, stabilization and transfer

(PALS) Pediatric Advanced Life Support
Basic Life Support (BLS) is a prerequisite. The goal of the Pediatric Advanced Life Support Course is to provide the learner with the information needed to recognize infants and children at risk for cardiopulmonary arrest, information and strategies needed to prevent cardiopulmonary arrest in infants and children and the cognitive and psychomotor skills needed to resuscitate and stabilize infants and children in respiratory failure, shock or cardiopulmonary arrest.
Audience: Pediatricians, house staff, emergency physicians, family physicians, nurses, paramedics, respiratory therapists and other healthcare providers who are responsible for the well-being of infants and children

Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP)
NRP is a one-day educational program that introduces the concepts and basic skills of neonatal resuscitation with the goal of teaching you to resuscitate newborns. The NRP materials are based on the American Academy of Pediatrics and American Heart Association Guidelines for Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Cardiovascular Care of the Neonate. The course consists of lectures and skills stations. Topics include: resuscitation principles, use of resuscitation devices, chest compressions, endotracheal intubations, medications, resuscitation of the preterm baby, ethics and care at the end of life.

Fundamentals of Critical Care Support (FCCS)
This course includes hi-fidelity simulation. This is a two-day comprehensive course addressing fundamental management principles for the first 24 hours of critical care. This course is designed for the non-intensivist. By participating in this course you should be able to: Prioritize assessment needs for the critically ill patient; select appropriate diagnostic tests; identify and respond to significant changes in the unstable patient; recognize and initiate management of acute life-threatening conditions; determine the need for expert consultation and/or prepare the patient for transfer.

S.T.A.B.L.E. (Sugar, Temperature, Airway, Blood Pressure, Lab Work and Emotional Support)
The goal of this full-day program is to help health care providers organize care of the sick newborn during the post resuscitation/pre-transport stabilization period.

(ENPC) Emergency Nursing Pediatric Core
This course is a two-day, intensive course designed to provide basic-level pediatric knowledge and skills associated with the delivery of professional nursing care to the pediatric patient in the Emergency Department. The instructors have been carefully chosen from professional nurses with expertise in the area of pediatric emergency care and experience in education. The ENPC is nationally recognized as the standard for nursing care of pediatric emergency patients.

(TNCC) Trauma Nursing Core Course
This is a two-day intensive course designed to provide basic level trauma knowledge and skills associated with the delivery of professional nursing care to the trauma patient in the Emergency Department. This course has been approved for 14.42 CECH by the Emergency Nurses Association. The instructors have been carefully chosen from professional nurses with expertise in the area of trauma care and experience in education. The TNCC is nationally recognized as the standard for nursing care of trauma patients. Successful students will receive a verification card valid for 4 years.

End of Life Care Certificate Program
This program designed for social workers consists of two weeks of intensive coursework at Smith College School for Social Work. To date, clinical social workers have been ill prepared to effectively address the complex needs of those facing the end of life. This End of Life Program offers 14 courses and a six month clinically supervised internship.

Interdisciplinary Certificate in Palliative Care
Audience: all health care professionals
Baystate Medical Center and Smith College School for Social Work are offering a transdisciplinary certificate in palliative care. The content, taught collaboratively by doctors, social workers, nurses and chaplains will model communication, breaking bad news, family meetings, spirituality, legal and ethical issues, diversity and disadvantage, pain and symptom management, grief and bereavement, and enhancing interdisciplinary communication and leadership. Participants will meet over two weekends for intensive coursework punctuated by case based seminars, collaborative writing projects with transdisciplinary supervision provided by experts in the field telephonically, online and using skype. This certificate program will also raise the leadership capacities of its participants.
